Assessment for the Proposed Airport Link

Report to Sinclair Knight Merz

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Introduction

The proposed Airport Link is being constructed as part of the Brisbane City Council's Transport Plan and the Queensland Government's Southeast Queensland Infrastructure Plan. Airport Link will connect The Inner City Bypass to the East-West Arterial Road with driven and cut and cover tunnels. Portals for the tunnels will be located at Bowen Bridge Road, Bowen Hills, Kedron Park Road, Kedron and Sandgate Road, Toombul.

To meet its cultural heritage duty of care, the Brisbane City Council (BCC) endorsed both Native Title claimants, Jagera Daran Pty Ltd and Turrbal Association Inc as Aboriginal Parties to undertake cultural heritage surveys in preparation for the development of a Cultural Heritage Management Plan under Part 7 of the *Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act 2003*. Sinclair Knight Merz (SKM) acting for BCC appointed Dr Jon Prangnell, of the University of Queensland Archaeological Services Unit (UQASU) to produce a report a single compliance report, based on the reports of the cultural heritage surveys provided by Jagera Daran Pty Ltd and Turrbal Association Inc. The two reports are:

Jagera Daran Pty Ltd 2006 *Cultural Heritage Survey and Assessment for the Proposed Airport Link.* Report to Brisbane City Council, SKM and Connell Wagner; and

Turrbal Association Inc 2006 *Cultural Heritage Report (Indigenous Hisotrical & Cultural Analysis) for the Proposed Airport Link Project.* Report to Brisbane City Council (MIPO).

The aims of this compliance report are to provide BCC and with an assessment of the cultural heritage risks, and strategies for their on-going management in regard to the proposed Airport Link project.

With the approval of both Aboriginal Parties, SKM supplied the reports they produced to Dr Prangnell. Dr Prangnell independently identified the methods each Aboriginal Party used to produce its report, the issues raised by both groups, the levels of significance they ascribed to areas and the strategies they proposed to manage the cultural heritage aspects of the proposed project. The results of this analysis were then combined to form this document.

Dr Prangnell does not in any way speak for the respective Native Title claimants; nor should he be perceived to do so. His role is only to integrate two separate reports, produced using different methodologies and providing different results into one concise and cohesive report that gives BCC and SKM direction to proceed with heritage planning for the proposed Airport Link project.

Turrbal Approach

The Turrbal Association Inc. entered into a contractual arrangement with the 'Airport Link Project Team' to undertake a cultural heritage study of the proposed Airport Link route (Turrbal 2006:4).

The Turrbal Association Inc states clearly that Turrbal cultural heritage is an integral part of Turrbal traditional laws and customs (Turrbal 2006:10-12) and their 'spirit' (Turrbal 2006:48). Spirit is intertwined in all aspects of life (including the physical world) and 'gives meaning and coherence to Aboriginal life' (Turrbal 2006:48). The method used by the Turrbal Association Inc. to develop their report was to analyse ethnohistorical accounts of the broader region around the project area and to hold discussions with a Turrbal elder and a Turrbal songwoman. The results of these discussions revealed that:

• Cultural heritage has a strong spiritual component and it is this spirit that provides the 'continued and unbroken relationship of the Turrbal people with places such as those affected by the proposed project' (Turrbal 2006:49)

• The Study Area is part of an interconnected series of pathways. In particular the project area follows a pathway that began near the present site of the Roma street Railway Station and follows the rout eof Bowen bridge Road and Herston road, with branches to various campsites (Turrbal 2006:55).

Jagera Approach

Jagera Daran Pty Ltd Environmental and Cultural Heritage Services entered into a contractual arrangement with the Airport Link alliance to undertook study of the cultural heritage of the proposed Airport Link project. Jagera Daran Pty Ltd Environmental and Cultural Heritage Services used a two-fold approach to the cultural heritage of the proposed Airport Link project. They undertook a field survey of the three proposed portal sites in March 2006 and also interviewed Jagera elders. No archaeological materials were identified during the surveys, however this does not mean that the areas hold no cultural heritage value. The interviews with the elders indicated that the area around all three proposed portals would have been important resource places. They also noted the previous work that had been conducted at the general location of the Bowen Bridge Road portal for the previous NSBT study.

Risks and Risk Management
