24.6.2 WJV SAFETY AND HEALTH MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

For both construction and operations, the workforce will be provided with awareness training regarding venomous snakes and biting insects, areas and times they are most likely to be encountered, how to react and how to provide first aid treatment. Work teams will be provided with appropriate first aid equipment to treat bites.

24.6.4 SAFETY CONTROLS

Traffic and journey accidents

As stated in the EIS Volume 1, Chapter 24 Health and Safety, section 24.6.4, the WJV is committed to the implementation of a travel fatigue management policy. As part of the implementation of the policy, the WJV commits to liaising with the Department of Transport and Main Roads (formerly Queensland Transport) for the construction and operational phases of the Project.

Furthermore the WJV is committed in assisting government agencies and the community in effective traffic management on all roads adjacent to the mine site and reducing the risk of traffic accidents. The WJV's commitment on traffic management is detailed in Chapter 12, section 12.7.1.
