

The above action was referred by Stanwell Corporation Ltd and Queensland Coke and Energy Pty Ltd, and received on February 2005, for decision whether or not approval is needed under Chapter 4 of the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act* 1999 (EPBC Act).
