5 LAND USE AND INFRASTRUCTURE

5.1 RESPONSE TO SUBMISSIONS ON DRAFT EIS

Submissions relating to the Queensland Curtis LNG (QCLNG) Project's LNG Component Land Use and Infrastructure as described and assessed in the Project draft environmental impact statement (EIS), and in particular draft EIS *Volume 5, Chapter 5: Land Use and Infrastructure* are summarised in *Table 5.5.1* below.
